

All figures have been rounded to the nearest one decimal place. This means that countries may appear to have the same score, or the change over time may appear inaccurate, but this is not the case when all decimal places are taken into account. Countries have been ranked and trends have been described on the basis of full scores not the rounded numbers that appear here.

Regional Economic Community (REC) averages are calculated by applying the REC's current membership configuration for all data years.

The Mo Ibrahim Foundation (MIF) is aware that some sources update their data sets after our documentation is sent to print. IIAG raw data are correct as per the date 'last accessed', which is stated for each indicator within the Data Portal (www.moibrahimfoundation.org/iiag/downloads/).

South Sudan and Sudan are excluded from all group averages pre-2011 as neither country existed in their current configurations before the secession of South Sudan in 2011.



The Ibrahim Index of African Governance (IIAG) measures the quality of governance in every African country on an annual basis. It does this by compiling data from diverse global sources to build an accurate and detailed picture of governance performance in African countries.

The broad aim of the IIAG is to better inform and sustain the debate on African governance by providing a transparent and user-friendly resource to:

- support citizens, governments, institutions and the private sector to accurately assess the delivery of public goods and services, and policy outcomes.

- encourage data-driven narratives on governance issues.
- help determine, debate and strengthen government performance.

The IIAG was created in 2007 in recognition of the need for a quantifiable tool to accurately measure and monitor African governance performance, its progress over time and across countries, and as a means of supporting effective and responsive solutions to complex public policy challenges in developing countries. Policies need to be evaluated by their results, which can only be done if accompanied by robust data.

TOGO

Togo has demonstrated great strides forward in governance performance, showing the fifth largest overall governance improvement on the continent.

Togo has made particular progress in *Sustainable Economic Opportunity*, registering the second largest improvement in Africa after Morocco. Togo's progress in *Sustainable Economic Opportunity* is the result of the largest improvement in Africa in the *Business Environment* and *Infrastructure* sub-categories. Despite these considerable gains, Togo remains in the bottom half of the rankings in this category.

In *Participation & Human Rights* Togo has shown the largest improvement in *Gender* in West Africa, demonstrating year-on-year progression in this sub-category.

Togo's progress has also extended to *Human Development*, showing a top ten improvement in this category triggered by positive score changes in all of the underlying sub-categories.

Overall governance: notable progression from a low base.

Togo scores 48.4 (out of 100) in overall governance, ranking 34th (out of 54) in Africa.

Togo shows overall governance improvement (+4.0) since 2011.

Togo scores lower than the African average and lower than the regional average for West Africa.

Togo is ranked 11th in West Africa in overall governance.

Safety & Rule of Law: concerning trends in Accountability and National Security.

Togo scores 55.3 in *Safety & Rule of Law*, ranking 24th on the continent.

Within the *Safety & Rule of Law* category, Togo's best sub-category performance is in *National Security*, scoring 85.3.

Togo's weakest sub-category performance in the *Safety & Rule of Law* category is in *Accountability*, scoring 28.3.

Togo has shown a deterioration (-0.3) in *Safety & Rule of Law* since 2011. This has been driven by deterioration in three of the four sub-categories: *Rule of Law* (-0.5), *Accountability* (-3.5) and *National Security* (-2.7).

Participation & Human Rights: year-on-year improvement in Gender.

Togo scores 48.4 in *Participation & Human Rights*, ranking 29th on the continent.

Within the *Participation & Human Rights* category, Togo's best sub-category performance is in *Gender*, scoring 56.6.

Togo's weakest sub-category performance in the *Participation & Human Rights* category is in *Participation*, scoring 35.8.

Togo has shown an improvement (+2.5) in *Participation & Human Rights* since 2011. This has been driven by improvement in two of the three sub-categories: *Participation* (+1.1) and *Gender* (+9.3).

Sustainable Economic Opportunity: impressive gains in Infrastructure and Business Environment.

Togo scores 37.5 in *Sustainable Economic Opportunity*, ranking 37th on the continent.

Within the *Sustainable Economic Opportunity* category, Togo's best sub-category performance is in *Public Management*, scoring 42.8.

Togo's weakest sub-category performance in the *Sustainable Economic Opportunity* category is in *Business Environment*, scoring 34.1.

Togo has shown an improvement (+9.5) in *Sustainable Economic Opportunity* since 2011. This has been driven by improvement in three of the four sub-categories: *Business Environment* (+11.6), *Infrastructure* (+19.5) and *Rural Sector* (+7.8).

Human Development: broad-based improvement across all sub-categories.

Togo scores 52.4 in *Human Development*, ranking 34th on the continent.

Within the *Human Development* category, Togo's best sub-category performance is in *Health*, scoring 65.6.

Togo's weakest sub-category performance in the *Human Development* category is in *Welfare*, scoring 43.4.

Togo has shown an improvement (+4.3) in *Human Development* since 2011. This has been driven by improvement in all three sub-categories: *Welfare* (+7.6), *Education* (+2.4) and *Health* (+2.8).




